In very limited situations an accused may claim that the victim consented to the accused's act (for example, if two parties agree to fist fight). Even in a consensual fight, consent is vitiated (i.e. is no longer a defence) if the accused intended to and actually caused serious bodily harm to the victim. Consent is never a defence to murder.
