The Reflective Practitioner

Schon's theory of reflective practice was developed in his seminal book 'The Reflective Practitioner: How Professionals Think in Action', first published in 1983 and then republished in 1991. Unlike Kolb's (1984) reflective theory, Schon's theory is not a multi-stage or circular model of reflection.

The reflective practitioner One of Donald Schon's greatest contributions to professional education was to stress the role of reflection within the learning process (Schon 1983). Examining professional practice, Schon identified two types of reflection: reflection-in-action and reflection-on-action.

Reflective Practice

Donald Alan Schon (1930-1997) trained as a philosopher, but it was his concern with the development of reflective practice and learning systems within organizations and communities for which he is remembered. Significantly, he was also an accomplished pianist and clarinettist - playing in both jazz and

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chamber groups.
